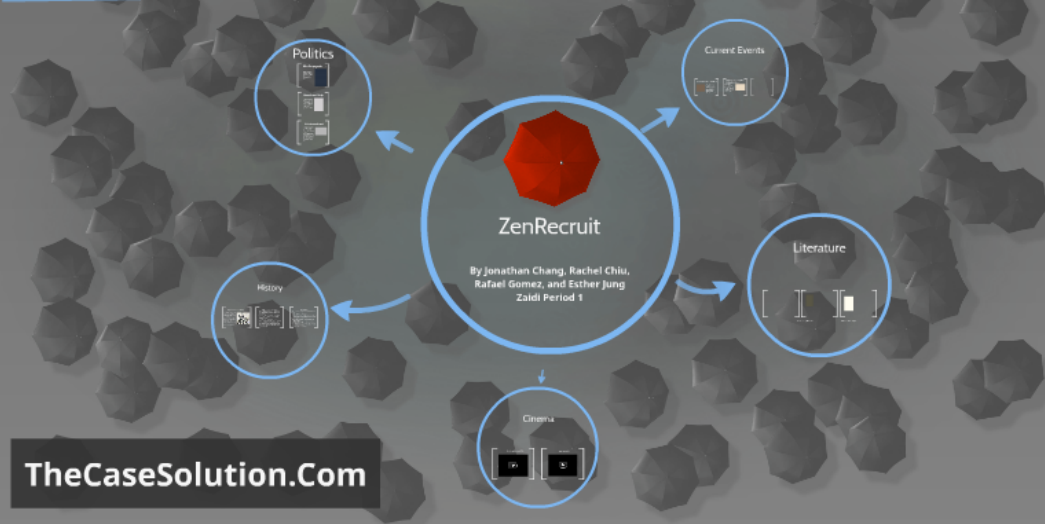

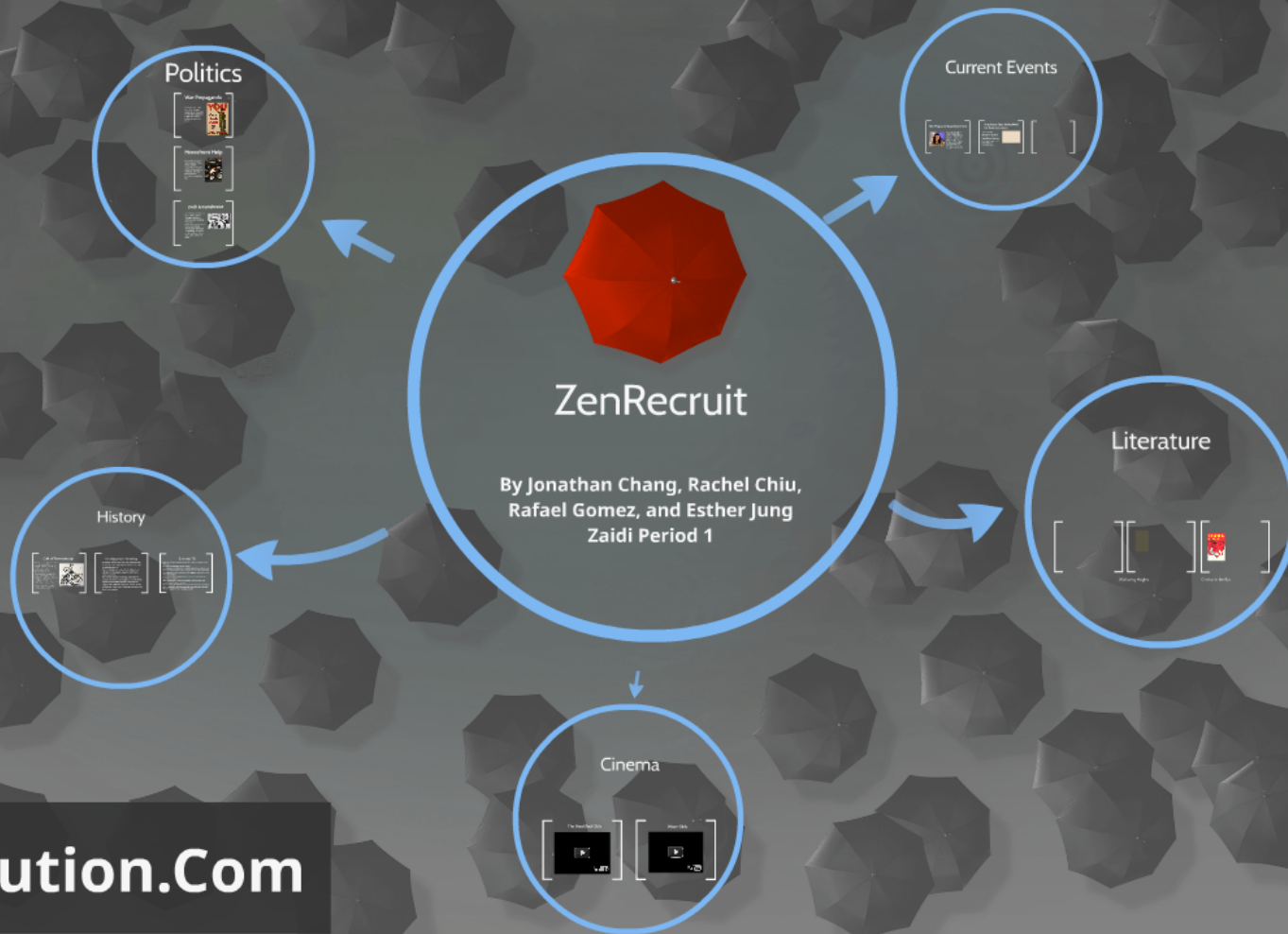

Emmett Till

- Emmett Till was a fourteen-year-old African-American from Chicago
- He went to Mississippi to visit family
- He was seen at a store with a white lady who had discovered that she was pregnant from a man who was not her husband
- She accused him of raping her, with support from others who were at the store
- As discovered during the trial, he was simply trying to be hospitable and polite
- The white lady and her "witnesses" abused this fact and twisted his behavior into rape
- He was dragged from his bed one night and beaten severely, shot in the head, and then dumped into a river with barbed wire wrapping him to a weighted barrel
